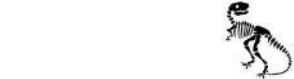
## Fountain Storytime

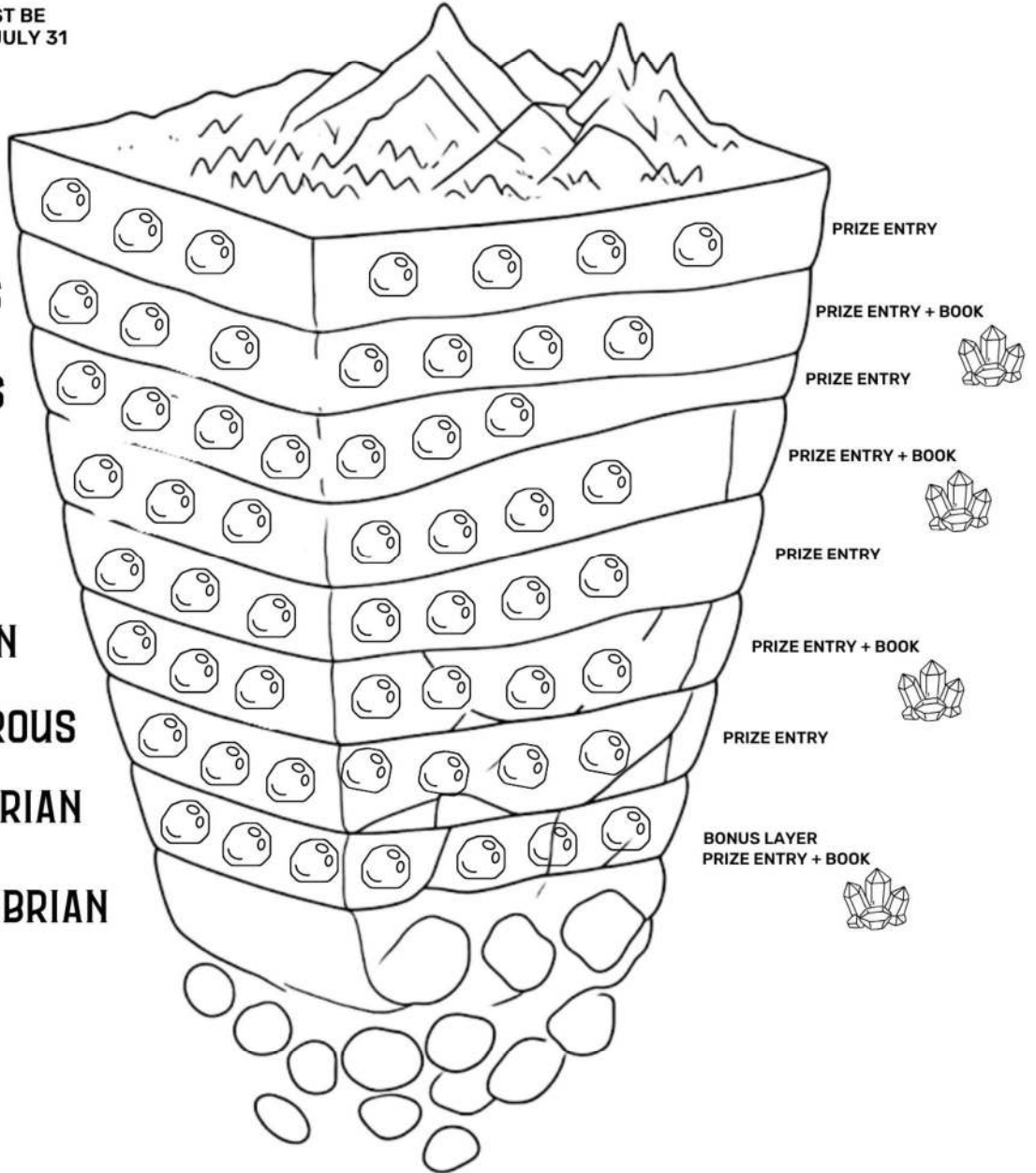

This year's summer reading theme is "Unearth a Story," which focuses on paleontology, archaeology, geology, & all things under the earth. We'll also be learning how to unearth our family & community stories.

As usual, we hope to take our community on all sorts of adventures. We are especially eager to hold our sixth annual Scavenger Hunt, sending library visitors around town to explore some of our local businesses & organizations. More than 35 locations are participating in our "Dinosaur Hunt." I hope families have a wonderful time seeking out all the dinosaurs & excavating some fun stories around town! I also hope that you'll keep track of your reading adventures this summer by picking up a reading log at our Help Desk. Set a daily reading goal & earn prize books throughout the summer.

One of the things we're going to unearth this summer is our community's story from 25 years ago. Marshall District Library put together a time capsule & invited groups in town to contribute documents, photos & other media. This included Exchange Club, Marshall Area Garden Club, Lion's Club, Marshall Historical Society, Marshall Public Schools, Mary Marshall Chapter of the DAR & numerous others. We're looking forward to seeing what the world looked like then (& we've saved an audio cassette player all these years just for this occasion)! This also means we're going to be putting together a new time capsule of the Marshall area, just in time to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

In addition to scavenger hunts & treasure chests of community history, we'll also be learning about the many layers of our earth & the things you might find there. Youth events will take place three days each week, with teen events on Wednesdays. Our History Center, which is open for use daily for researchers, will also be holding drop-in hours with a librarian twice each week. In addition to the activities we will hold at the library, we are going to go on a variety of adventures in our neighborhoods. We hope our youngest patrons will join us at places like Capitol Hill School, Brooks Memorial Fountain, & Marshall Area Farmers Market for our early literacy events & storytimes. We'll be exploring the beauty of nature with Wilder Creek & holding a variety of messy parties, including our annual Foam Party at Calhoun County Fairgrounds.

We hope that all of you will keep reading & learning all summer long. I look forward to seeing you at the library this summer!
